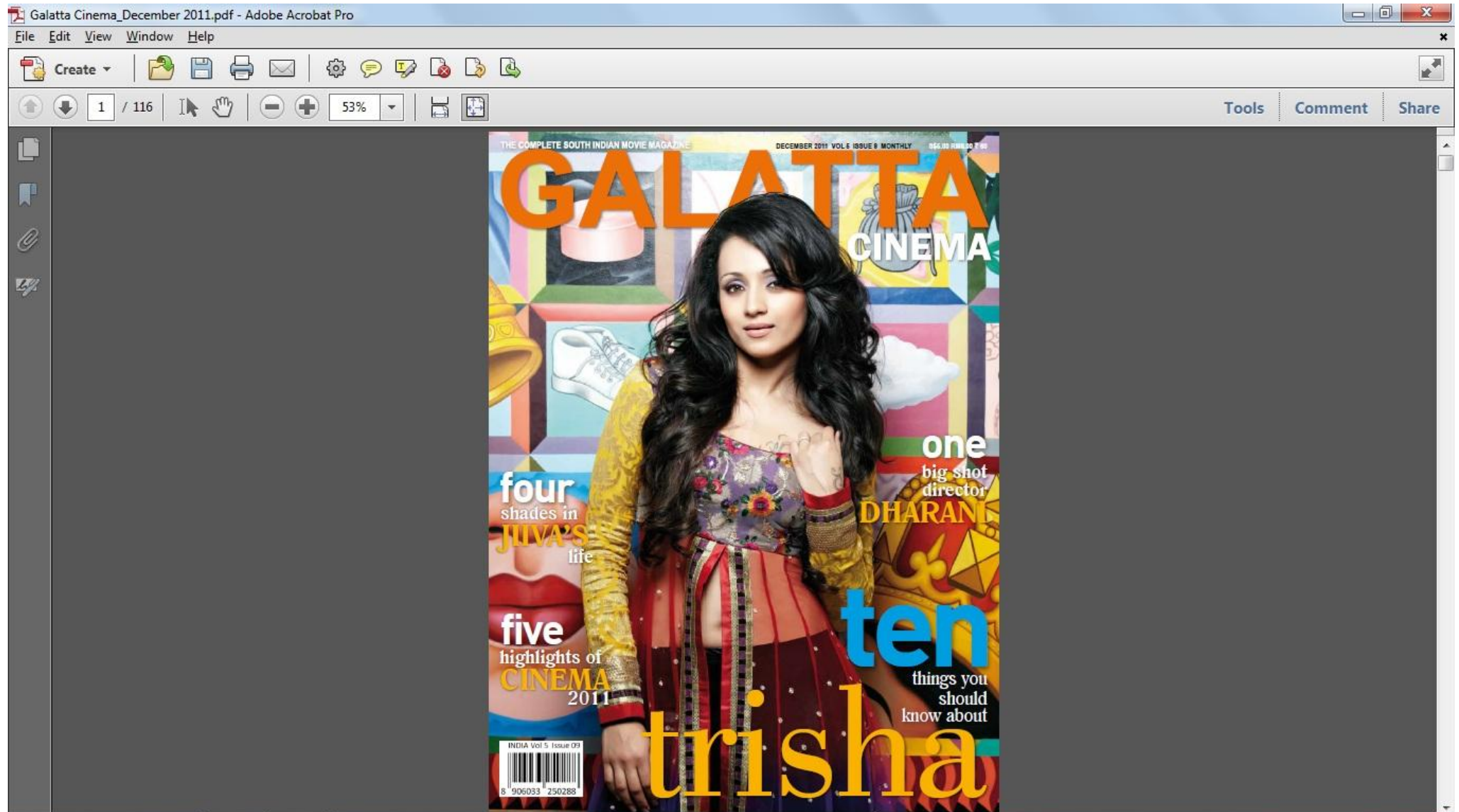



Tutorial to embed hyperlinks using Adobe Acrobat X Pro

2.0. Open the document in Adobe Acrobat X Pro




2.1. Click 'Tools' → 'Content'

2.2. Select the 'Link' tool under 'Add or Edit Interactive Object'

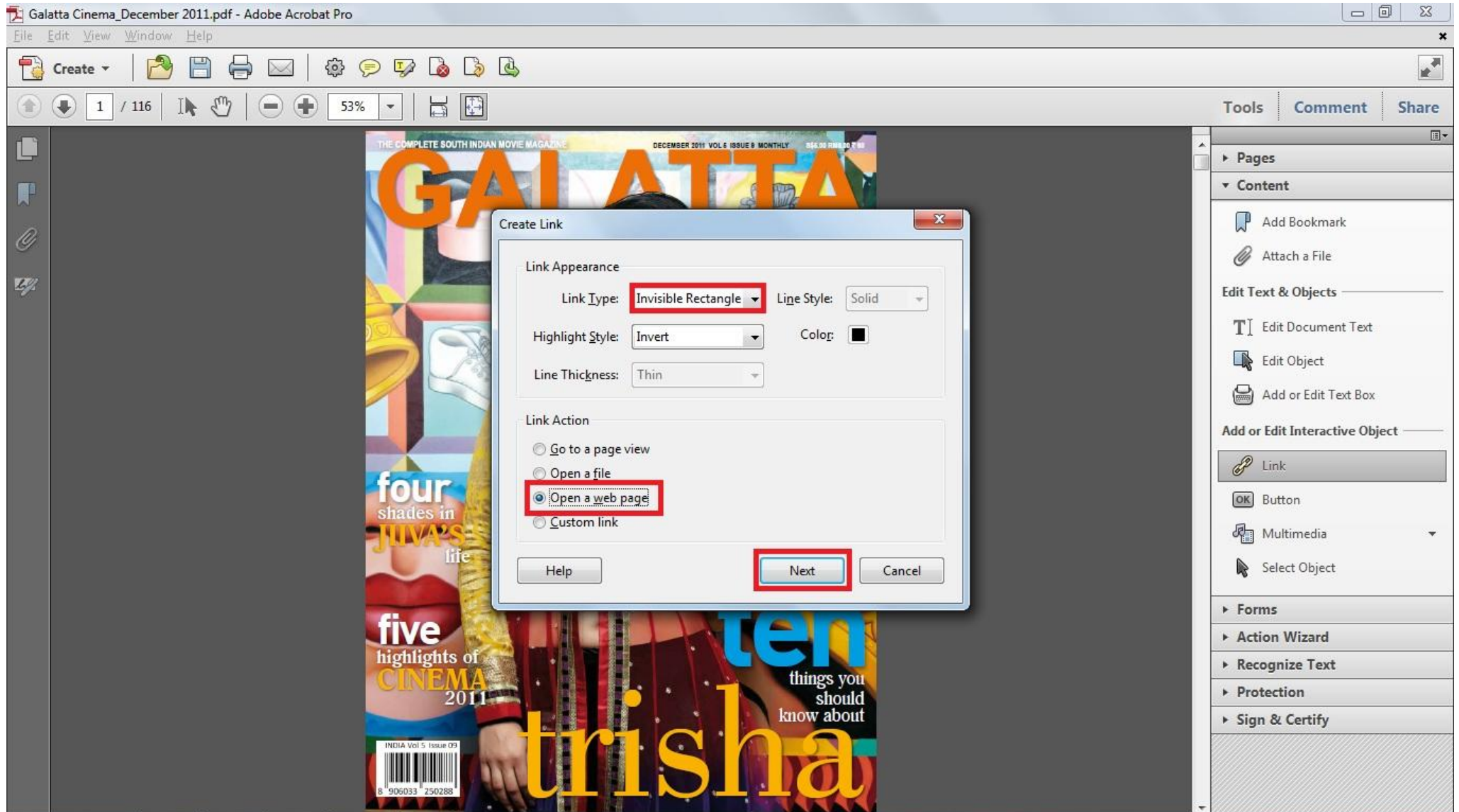

2.3. 'Click and Drag' to draw out a rectangular area in the size and position of where the 'Link' should be placed



2.4. Ensure 'Invisible Rectangle' is selected under 'Link Type' and select 'Open a web page' under 'Link Action' → click 'Next'



2.5. Type in the 'URL' for the link and click 'OK' (You have now successfully embedded a link to the document)
